

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING :

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by Robert Parker, Lieutenant of Artillery in the late army of the United States there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said Robert Parker a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland.

In the tenth District of the Conallion Lands Beginning at a Bush tree the numbered corner and running East by Sol N^E 2088 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a sugar thence South by Sol N^S 2044 One hundred and thirty perches to a sugar, thence West by Sol N^W 2086 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a sugar, thence North by Sol N^N 2052 One hundred and thirty perches to the place of Beginning containing Two hundred acres & allowance of six perches for Roads of a number MMLXXXVII

with its appurtenances unto the said Robert Parker his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the

said Robert Parker his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

Robert Parker his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and

reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Biddle
