To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING:

KNOW YE,

Thornbury Lieutenant _____ That in consideration of the services rendered by *Francis* _____ in the late army of the *United States* _____ there is granted by the said commonwealth unto *Samuel Alexander* assignee of the said *Francis Thornbury* a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of *Westmoreland* In the tenth district of donation Lands beginning at a Sugar tree the numbered corner and running East by Lot No. 2122 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Birch Tree thence South by Lot No. 2142 one hundred and thirty perches to a Maple Tree, thence West by Lot No. 2121 two hundred and sixty one perches to an Iron Wood Tree, thence North by Lot No. 2141 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning Containing Two hundred Acres and allowance of Six ff Cent for Roads by *cc* Numbered *MMCXIII*

with its appurtenances unto the said *Samuel Alexander* _____ his heirs and assigns forever: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Samuel Alexander* _____ his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said *Samuel Alexander* _____ his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof *The Honorable Charles Biddle* _____ Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the state seal to be affixed the *fifteenth* day of *December* _____ in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty *six* and of the commonwealth the *Eleventh* _____
