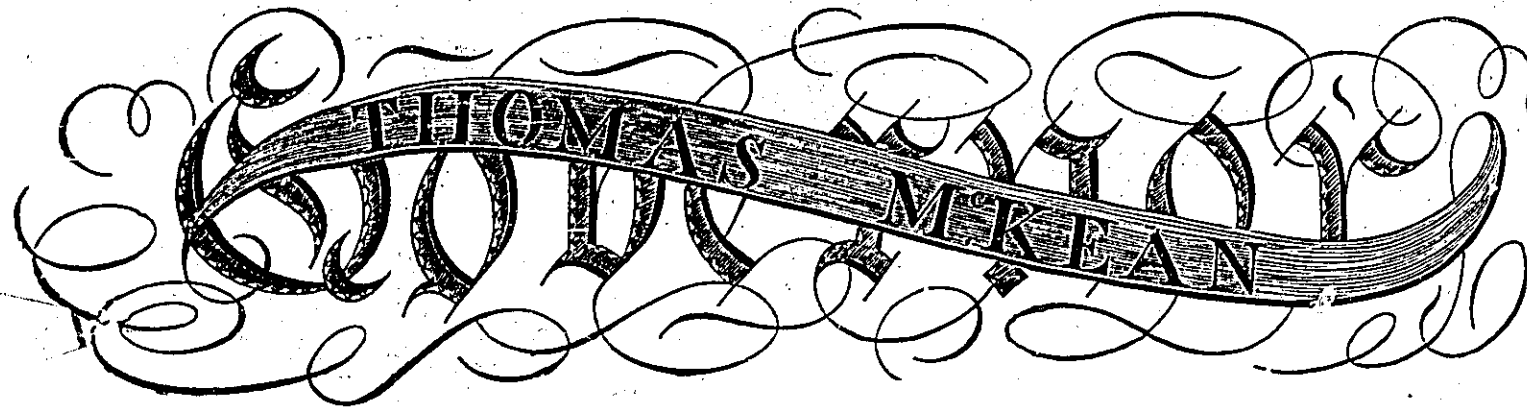

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Jacob Wilrich private in the late Army of the United States and in the Army of the Revolution there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Jacob Wilrich a certain tract of land No. 318 called "Fortune" situated in Donation District No. 2 in Butler County Beginning at a Chesnut thence by lot No. 297, North one hundred thirty perches to a black Oak, thence by lot No. 319, West, two hundred sixty one perches to a black Oak, thence by No. 331, South one hundred thirty perches to a black Oak, and thence by lot No. 317, East two hundred sixty one perches to the Beginning, containing Two hundred acres and allowance of six perches for roads &c. which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed 21st February 1785.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Jacob Wilrich and his Heirs to the use of him the said Jacob Wilrich his Heirs and Assigns forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these Presents, at Lancaster this fourth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six and of the Commonwealth the twenty-eighth.
