Miscellaneous items relating to members of the Stackhouse family of Bucks County. Typescript essay (incomplete) relating the career of Thomas Stackhouse (d. 1744), Bucks County landholder and surveyor and member of the Pennsylvania General Assembly from 1711 and listing the names of his wives and children. Two copies of a published photograph of John R. Stackhouse, and commissions for him as a justice of the peace in Bristol Township, Bucks County, 1885 and 1890. Notice informing Amos Howell of his liability to military duty, signed by Joseph Stackhouse, assessor of Bristol Township, Bucks County, August 18, 1862; letter to Joseph Stackhouse from James Welch of Company I, Col. Wistar's California Regiment at Adamstown, Maryland, December 26, 1861, describing picket duty, Christmas at the camp, and other matters. Ledger, 1797-1819, relating to cash, clothing, grain, farm animals, and equipment, etc. Broadsides for sales of the farm and personal property of the late John B. Brown of Bristol Township, Bucks County, 1870-1877; Jesse L. Stackhouse listed as agent for the executrix in the 1870 sale. Program for annual banquet, Bristol Lodge, No. 25, Free and Accepted Masons, Dec. 2, 1922; undated song sheet for the Fred Wicke Entertainers of Philadelphia.
