Algernon Sydney and Robert Restalrig Logan Papers

2.5 cu. ft.

Consists of manuscript and printed material of or pertaining to members of the Logan family, including those of James Logan, first provincial secretary of Wm. Penn, his father Patrick Logan, and descendents Algernon Sydney, and Robert Restalrig Logan, ca. 1680's-1945. The collection contains 3 volumes of printed and manuscript copies of Indian treaties, conferences, and other memorials relating to Indian Affairs, covering the period 1722-1762, copies of John Dickinson correspondence, 1753-1776, and one volume of minutes and related items of the Indiana Company, 1776-1789.

Material relating directly to the Logan-Wister families (Algernon S. Logan's wife was Mary Wynne Wister, and his mother, who was the wife of John Dickinson Logan, was Susan Wister) consists of 1 cu. ft. of family portraits and photographs, published collections of poetry and novels written by Algernon S., and Robert R. Logan, the journal of Mary Wynne Wister, 1873-1880, a Biographical Sketch of Algernon Sydney Logan published in 1934, and related genealogical materials.

Since this book seems to have been in Mary W. Wister's possession before her marriage, it may have been handed down in her family. Joseph Bullock, a member of the Indiana Company, married a daughter of John Baynton (1726-1773); their daughter Rebecca Bullock married (in 1803) Charles Jones Wister; and they were the parents of William Wynne Wister, Mary Wynne Wister's father.

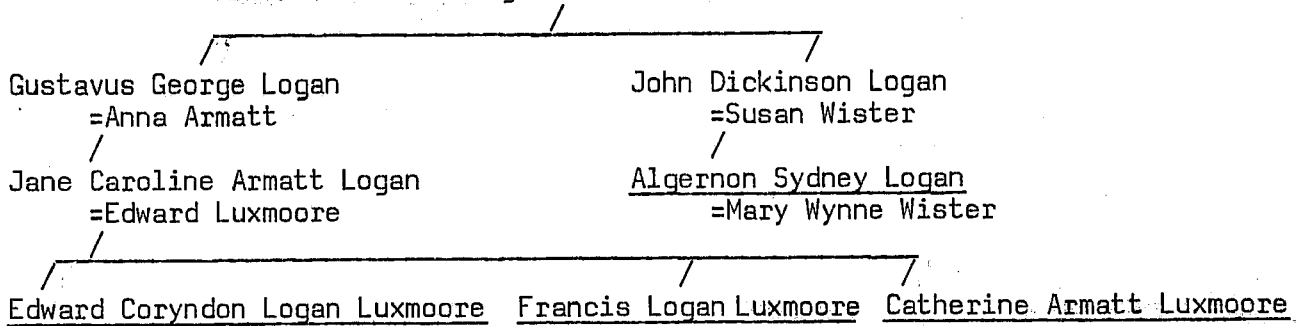

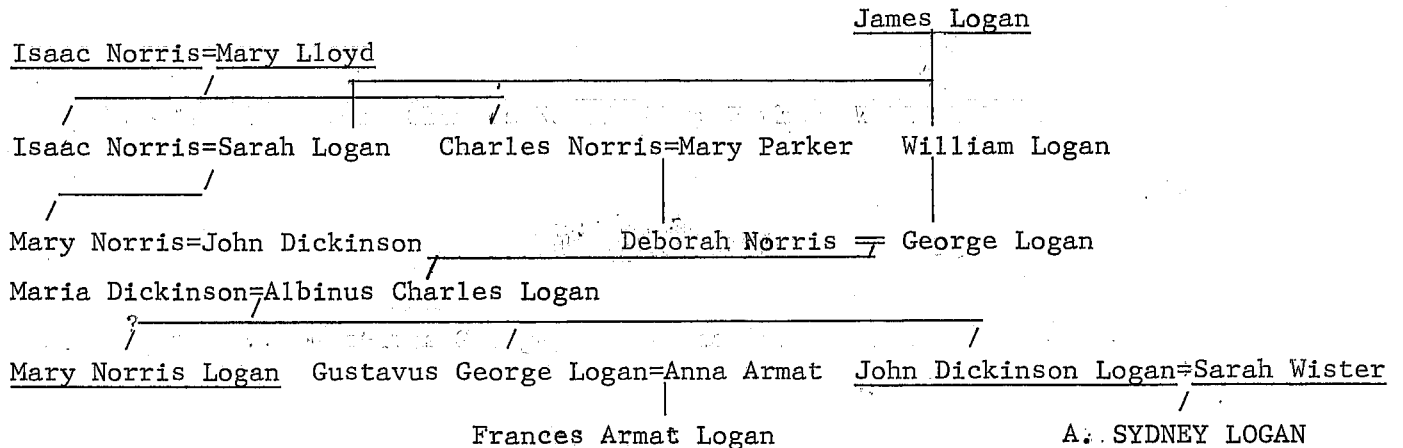

ALGERNON SYDNEY LOGAN had a double relationship with the Wister family. His wife was Mary Wynne Wister, and his mother (wife of John Dickinson Logan) was Susan Wister. Susan Wister's father, John Wister, and Mary Wynne Wister's grandfather, Charles Jones Wister, were brothers; so Mary Wynne was Susan's daughter-in-law and also her cousin once removed.

John (b. 1776) and Charles Jones (b. 1782) were sons of Daniel Wister and his wife, Lowry Jones. Their older sister Sarah (b. 1761) was the author of Sally Wister's Journal. In the following lists of descendants, underlining identifies persons represented in the family picture collection.

John Wister (b. 1776) married Elizabeth Harvey. Their children were Sarah, married John Stevenson; William, married Sarah Logan Fisher; John, Charles, Ann, Jones, and Mary, all unmarried; Susan, married John Dickinson Logan (father of A. SYDNEY LOGAN); and Louis, married Elizabeth Emlen Randolph.

William and Sarah Logan Wister were the parents of William Rotch, John, Langhorne, Jones, Francis, and Rodman Wister.

Charles Jones Wister (b. 1782) was twice married. Children by his first wife, Rebacca Bullock, were William Wynne, married Rachel Wilson; Mary Baynton, married Dr. W. S. W. Ruschenberger; and Emily, unmarried.

William Wynne and Rachel Wister were the parents of Rachel, married B. Rogers; Alexander Wilson, married Susan Witson; Hannah Lewis and Emily Wynne, unmarried; and Mary Wynne, wife of A. SYDNEY LOGAN.
