OZIAS FERREE PAPERS

Consists mainly of the letters of an Iowa farmer, Ozias Ferree (b. 1818, d. 1909), to the family of his wife's cousin, Mrs. Daniel Leaman, in Lancaster, Pa., 1865-1909. Ferree moved from his home in Adams County in 1863, to Panora, Iowa, where he settled permanently. His letters contain excellent descriptions of his original journey west and life in Iowa. The collection also includes a photostat copy of the family tree of the descendants of Madam Mary Ferree, a French Huguenot, of whom Mr. Ferree was descended, and a copy of an article published in the Annals of Iowa titled An Early Settler in Iowa: Westward Expansion in Microcosm by Dr. Bertha R. Leaman, granddaughter of Mr. Daniel Leaman.
