EFHRATA COLLECTION

These papers were apparently a part of the library of Samuel W. Pennypacker, who in 1882 purchased them from a bookseller in Philadelphia. Pennypacker concluded that they had formerly been in the possession of William M. Fahnestock. Much of the collection is said to stem from Jacob Martin (1725-1790), a member of the Ephrata Community. A few items relate to the later community at Snow Hill, Franklin County.

Most of the items are mounted in a book, $16\frac{1}{2}$ "x 12" x 1", bound in blue leather, containing 58 numbered leaves (including the back end paper); a number are loose at the back of the book. A few extraneous items have been added since the time of acquisition by the Commonwealth.

This rough list was drawn up as a preliminary guide by Eugene E. Doll, July 26, 1954. No attempts at positive identification or technical description have been made. The count of items has not been checked.

Other Ephrata materials appear in the "Provincial Papers," currently being broken up and reorganized by W. D. Hunter, and in the Map Case, Drawer # 30.
