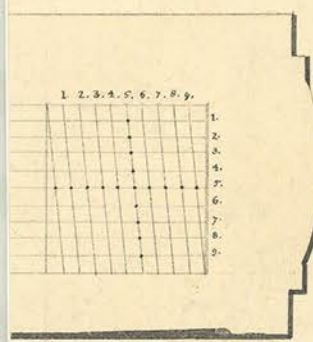


125.50 FEET ABOVE TIDE.

FROM THE POINT WHERE THE LINE STRIKES THE SIDE OF MUNCY MOUNTAIN, IT CAN BE CONDUCTED BY THE BALD EAGLE TO THE SUSQUEHANNA, OR BY THE LITTLE BALD EAGLE TO PENN'S VALLEY OR THE JUNIATA, AT AN EXPENSE NOT GREATER THAN WOULD BE INCURRED FOR A SIMILAR NUMBER OF MILES IN ANY PART OF THE STATE; THE GROUND POSSESSING UNUSUAL FACILITIES FOR GRADING. THE ACTUAL SURVEYS WERE NOT EXTENDED BEYOND THE POINT INDICATED, IN CONSEQUENCE OF THE LATENESS OF THE SEASON.
