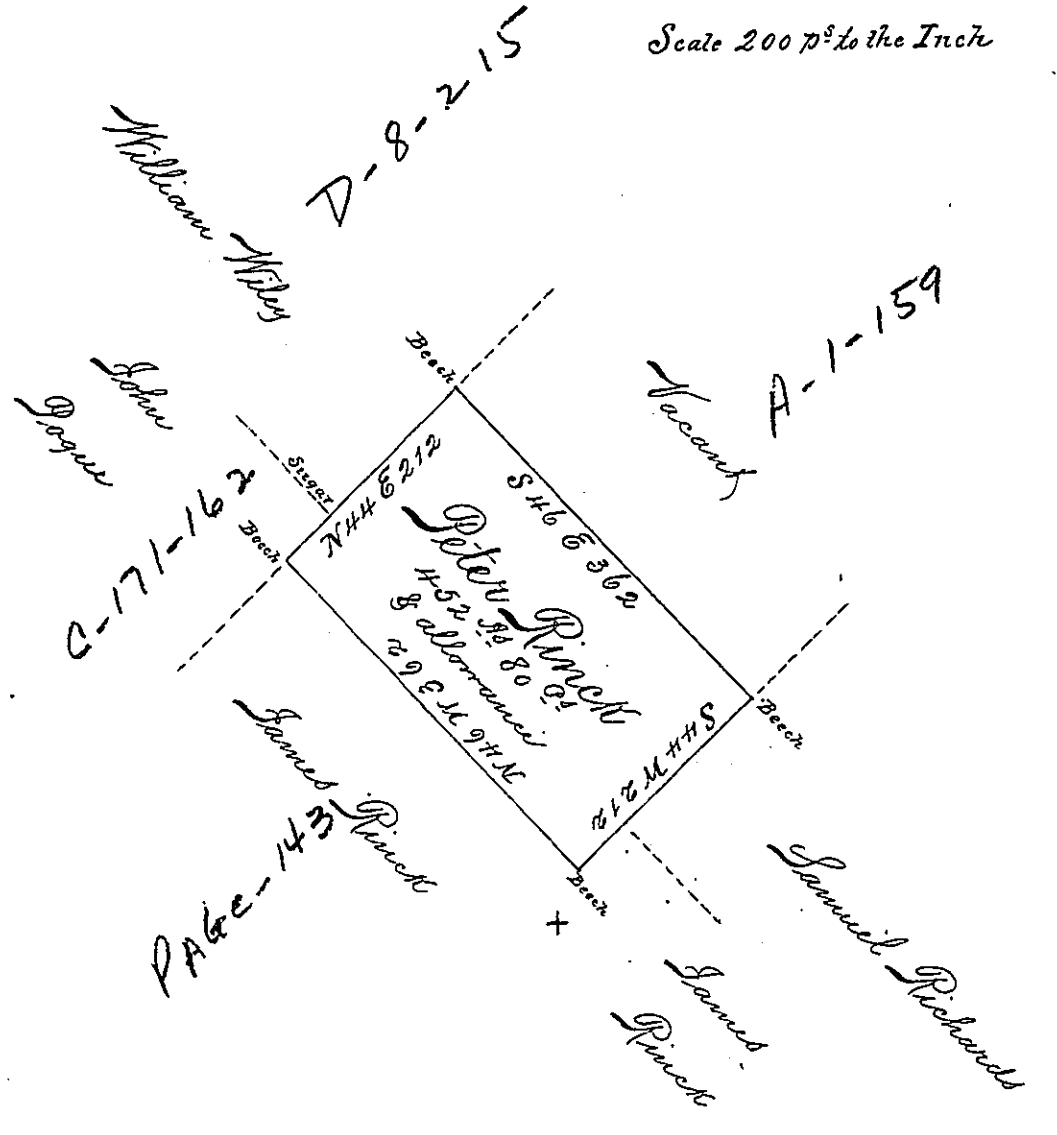


Scale 200 P^s to the Inch
