



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the sixteenth day of January 1733 there was Surveyed to John Ann Huffnail three hundred Acres of Land Situate in Oley in the County of Philad^e. Adjoining to a tract whereon the said Huffnail has already settled - Beginning at a Red Oak a corner of Philip Culvins land thence by the same North West two hundred & twenty three perches to a Heap of Stones thence by ^a Vacant Land North East two hundred & thirty six perches to a post thence by the same South East two hundred & thirty one perches to a post in the Line of Emale Peters land thence by ^{the} same South West Sixty perches to a Hick Mark^s for a corner thence by other Land of the sd. Huffnail North West Eight perches to a post thence by the said Land South West one hundred and Sixty six perches to the place of Beginning Containing the above Quantity of three hundred Acres with the usual Allowance of Six p^ct.
