



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> proprietor bearing Date the 16<sup>th</sup> Day of January Anno Dom 1737. I have survey'd and Laid Out unto John Harris in the Township of Penns borough in the County of Lancaster Three Hundred and Eleven Acres of Land with allowance of Six p Cent Beginning at the mouth of Conecogwonne Creek and from thence up Susquehanna River Traversing the several Courses thereof about two hundred and ninety seven pches to a Locust Thence South Eighty Degrees Westerly One hundred ninety two pches to a White oak Thence South Seven Degrees Westerly Sixty one pches to a White Oak Thence South Twenty Degrees Easterly Eighty three pches to a Locust by the s<sup>d</sup> Creek Thence Down the same Traversing the several Courses thereof near about Three hundred and Twenty pches to the place of Beginning.
