



By virtue of a Warrant dated the 25th day of January 1867 on the 27th day of June 1867 surveyed to C. N. Waller the above described tract or piece of land situate on the head waters of the East Branch of Dyberry creek in the township of Lebanon in the County of Wayne, Bounded as follows Beginning at a post and stones the north East corner of a tract of land in the warrantee name of S. G. Goodrich, Thence by same south Eighty Eight and a half degrees west Eighty Rods to a Beech Tree Corner. Thence by land in warrantee name of Nathan Hooboro, north one and a half degree west twenty six Rods to a post and stones corner. Thence by John Parker warrantee north Eighty Eight and a half degrees East seventy four and six tenths Rods to a post and stones corner. Thence by land in the warrantee name of Timothy Cavanaugh south thirteen and a half degrees East twenty six and six tenths Rods to the place of Beginning. Containing Eleven Acres and one hundred and thirty six perches with an allowance of six per cent for roads
