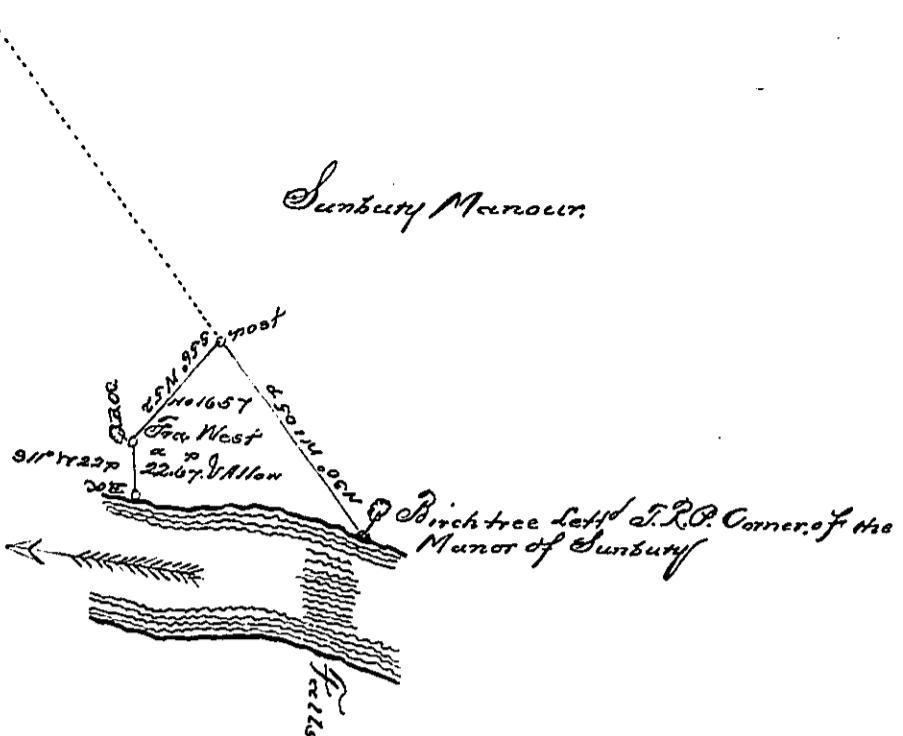


Courses up the River from the
