



By Warrant from ye Proprietaries dated the 13th of Apr: 1734 Surveyed out on the Twenty sixth day of May 1734 to Thomas Collins a Tract of Land Situate on the East Side of ye River Schuylkill in the County of Philad: Beginning at a Maple Tree obliterated of ye s<sup>d</sup> River thence by Land of Moses Coats North Seventy Degrees 00' - three hundred and seventy perches to a Black Oak Saplin a corner, 022, s<sup>d</sup> Moses Coats Land thence by Vacant Land South Twenty Degrees East Eightyfour perches to a post about Ten feet West from a Chestnut Oak marked with three notches thence by Vacant Land South Seventy Degrees West Four hundred and fifty perches to a Dead Black Oak on the Bank of ye s<sup>d</sup> River thence up the same to the place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred acres with usual allowance.
