



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Newton Township in Cumberland County containing Ninety Acres and ninety five perches and the usual allowance of six P. Cent for Roads. The above Survey (together with sundry others) was made for a certain Company in the Month of June 1767 whereof Patrick Ewing was one, and altho his Order of Survey bearing Date August the 25<sup>th</sup> 1766 No 950 was located on other Lands, the Company requested that the above Tract should be returned on said Ewing's Order of Survey but as the said Company for several years refused paying the Fees for the whole of the Surveys then made at their Instance, they were not returned and in the Interim Samuel Young producing a Warrant located on the Spot bearing Date the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1770 the Land is returned on said Warrant.
