



A Draught of Two Tracts of Land, Situated in Upper Salford Township, in the County of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania. The first including the Meffauagz Contains 102^{ac.} 155 perches and the usual Allowance for Roads. And the Second Contains 42^{ac.} 6 perches and the said usual allowance. The first was granted to Paul Leydy by Warrant of the 24th March 1739 and the Second by Warrant of the 29th February Anno 17th 40 Who by his Deed Poll of the 7th March 1741 Sold and Conveyed his Right to the Same to John Foust who now again Sold his Right to the Same to George Egert who now intends to get out a Patent for the Same. Containing together one Hundred and Fifty Three Acres and 114 Perches of Land Strick or One Hundred and forty five Acres of Land, together with the usual allowance at six per Cent for Roads. Re-surveyed at the Request of, and for the said George Egert on the 15th October Anno. 1778.
