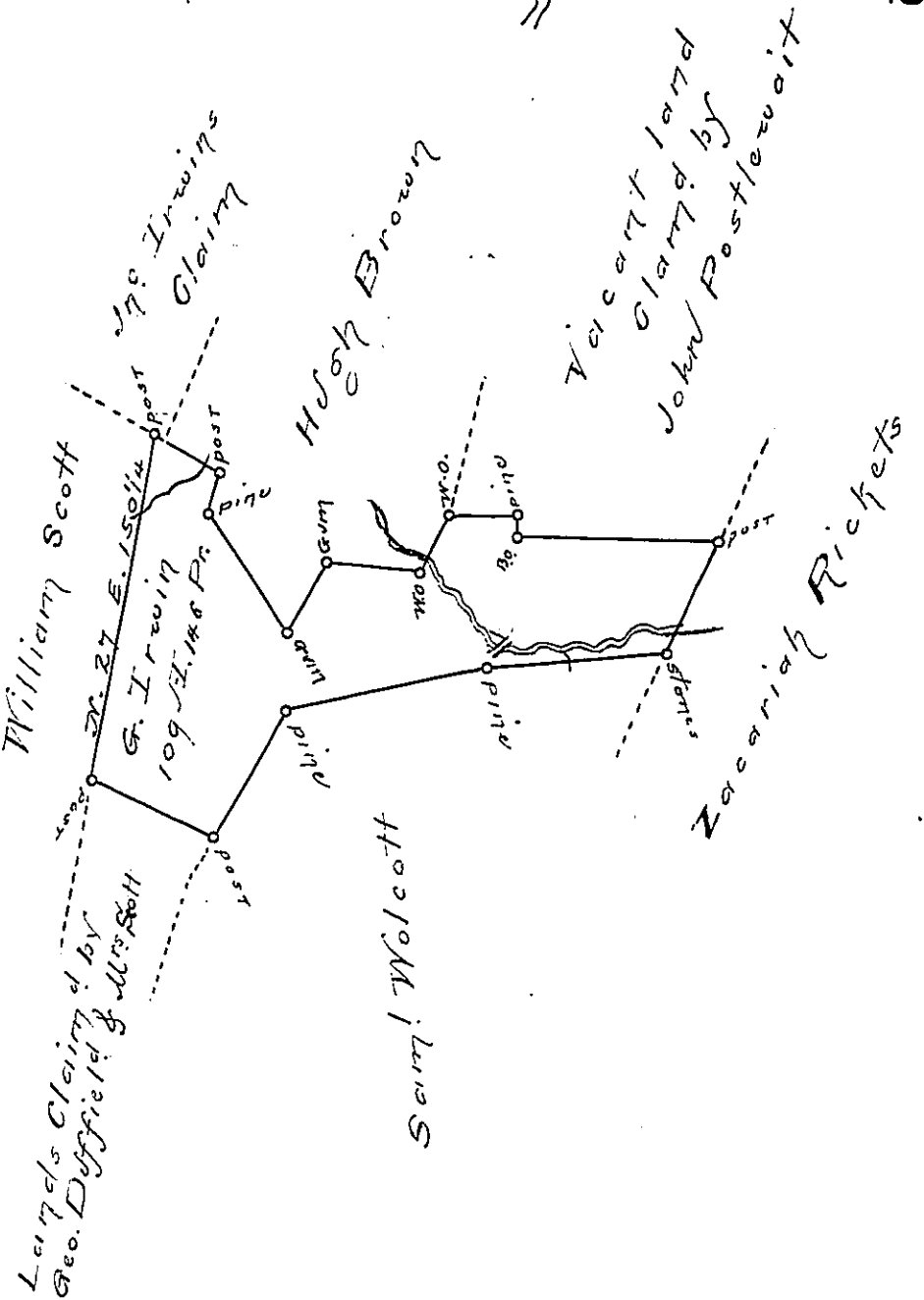

Surveyed the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September 1802 agreeable to the lines of the adjacent Survey Intereuance of a Warrant Granted to George Irwin of the County of York Dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of March 1743.
