

Survey of

Wm Smith has a ~~warrant~~ for 348^{As.} made by Smout by virtue of a Warrant dated 16th 8 ber 1738. Wm Smith has sold to Andrew Duncan one half amounting ^{to} 174^{As.} & Duncan has had an addition ^{since} made to his 174^{As.} & these remains to Wm Smith 174^{As.} which is to be returned according to Tho. Cooksons Draught.

Not knowing of the Warrant of 16th 8 ber 1738 I had ordered y^e Land to be divided between Duncan & Smith & now it is divided let y^e Return be made accordingly, saying y^e whole was 348^{As.} was surveyed to Smith who having sold a moiety to Duncan ^{Smiths} part is as follows.
