



Tract partly in York & partly in Shrewsbury Townships, in the County of York, containing as above set forth twenty three acres, thirty six perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. being part of a larger tract of 144<sup>ad.</sup> 58<sup>ad.</sup> & allowance, originally surveyed by William Matthews dated on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month A.D. 1766 in pursuance of a warrant for 100<sup>ad.</sup> granted to Jacob Spitter dated the 23<sup>d</sup> day of September 1762 the above part surveyed and divided off from the said larger tract by Peter Haugler for Jacob Haugler let. ss. on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1812, as appears by Draughts found in the possession of the present owner Joseph Younger, <sup>and given at the request of said Younger</sup> the draught is examined, calculated and returned for confirmation, December 28<sup>th</sup> 1821.
