



By Virtue of a warrant from the Honble. Proprietaries bearing Date the sixth Day of October Anno Dom 1738

I have Survey'd and Laid out unto Matthias Shitz adjoining Nicholas Clay in the County of Lancaster on the west Side Susquehanna river one hundred and sixty two Acres of Land with allowance of six P. Cent.

Beginning at a Hickory a Corn of the said Clays land thence one hundred and twenty six perches to a Hickory thence south forty nine Degrees Easterly one hundred and six perches to a white oak, thence South westerly four perches, thence south easterly eight perches thence North Easterly four perches into the second line by the same twenty perches to a small bush, thence South thirty six Degrees westerly thirty perches to a post thence South sixty nine Degrees westerly one hundred and eighty one perches to a white oak, thence North twenty One Degree westerly one hundred forty four perches to a Black Oak, thence North Seventy Degrees westerly five perches to the place of Beginning.
