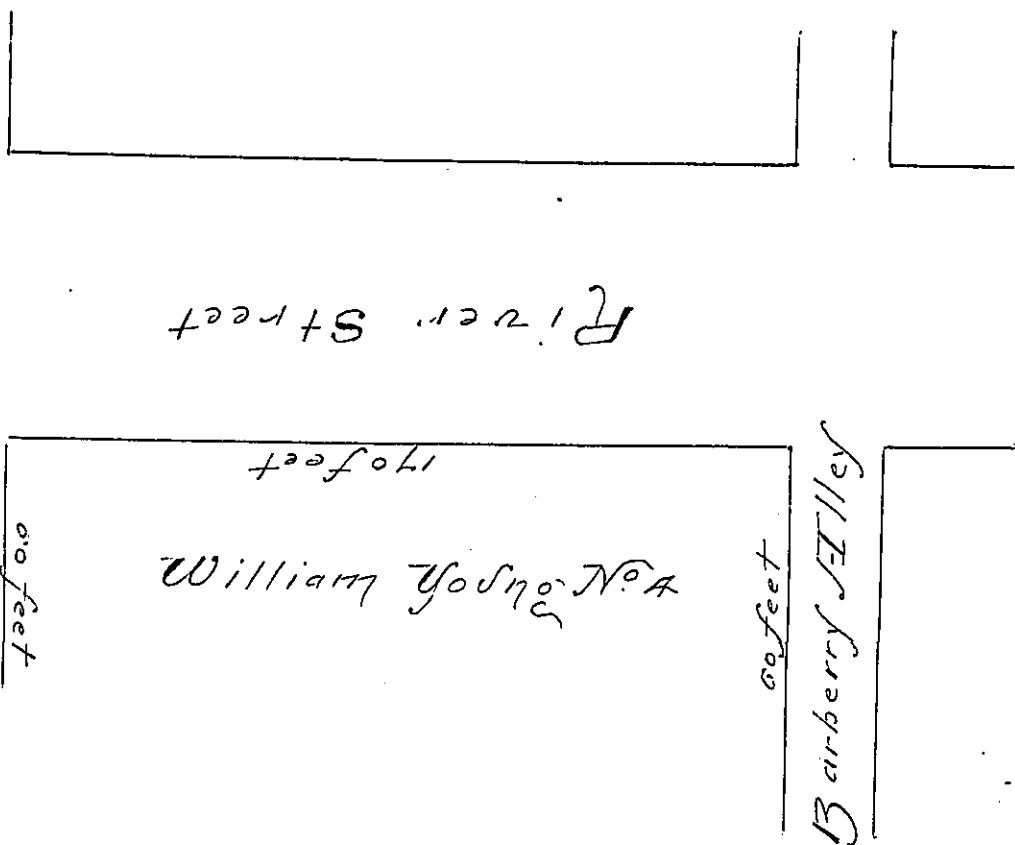


The square



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16th of June 1742 a Survey was made on the 3^d of July following of a certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Sandusky in the County of Northumberland, numbered in the general Plan of said Town Four, and granted to William Young, containing in Breadth East and West Sixty feet and in length North and South One hundred & seventy feet, bounded Westward by Lot number ONE, Northward by the Public Square, Eastward by River Street and Southward by Barberry Alley, as by the general Plan of said Town, remaining in the Surveyor General's Office will appear.
