



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of July 1772 a Survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> of July following a certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Sumbury in the County of Northumberland marked in the general Plan of S<sup>o</sup> Town one hundred and Sixty eight and granted to Alexander Young containing in Breadth East & West Sixty feet & in length North & South Two hundred and thirty feet bounded Westward by Deer Street Southward by Blackberry Street, Eastward by Lot number 167 and Northward by Barberrys alley as by the general Plan remaining in the Surveyor General's Office will appear.
