

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary dated 1738, for laying ^{out} unto Peter Clubb an addition to his ship in the County of Lancaster there was laid out the Township of A Certain Tract of Land Beginning Land thence extending by the same and Conrad Sharp's East one hundred and twenty perches to a Black Oak North eighty deg. East one hundred & twenty perches to a Vacant Land North ten deg. West one hundred & twenty Land South Eighty deg. West one hundred and twenty perches taining Eighty five acres & an allowance of Six Ct. for Roads.
