



The above is a draft of a tract of land Situate in Salem Township Mercer County on the waters of Little Shenango. Containing four hundred acres 10 per. with allowance &c. Surveyed this 1st day of March A.D. 1824, In pursuance of a warrant granted to Samuel Crawford the 31st day of March 1794 and settled by Thomas Deamars who was residing on it with his family at the time of surveying and marking out the lines of it. And who has now compromised with Joseph Lyon, the representative of Samuel Crawford the warrantee the improvements and a house, and barn, and not less than 20 acres cleared and cultivated a clever orchard &c.
