



A Draft of one hundred and seventy nine acres & thirty four perches of land with six per cent for roads situate in Turbett Township in Halifax, late Cumberland, county, which appears to have been surveyed originally 16<sup>th</sup> April 1767 in pursuance of an Order to William Christy dated 22<sup>th</sup> November 1766 & 1994 said to contain 153<sup>ac</sup> 14<sup>pc</sup> Resurveyed 29<sup>th</sup> October 1803 by William Harris late Deputy Surveyor in pursuance of an Order of the Board of Property, dated 25<sup>th</sup> August 1803 and said to contain 178<sup>ac</sup> 14<sup>pc</sup> with six per cent for road including an addition of 23<sup>ac</sup> 14<sup>pc</sup> and resurveyed by Mr. McLean late Deputy Surveyor 11<sup>th</sup> July 1811 including said addition in pursuance of said order & found to contain 179<sup>ac</sup> 53<sup>pc</sup> of land with six per cent, with the following note, "there are about eight acres of the addition cleared fenced and in a state of cultivation in possession of William Wharton assignee of William Christy." as appears from official papers filed in my Office. Examined 9<sup>th</sup> June 1819.

Note there is a Warrant of 8<sup>th</sup> May 1819 granted to Catherine Christy for the land called "addition", in the above draft put into my hands
