



These may certify the General Surveyors Office that by virtue of a Warrant under the hands of Edward Shippen Griffith Owen Thomas Story and James Logan the Prop<sup>ts</sup> and Govern<sup>r</sup> Com<sup>rs</sup> of Property and the Seal of the Province to me directed bearing date the 4<sup>th</sup> of ye<sup>th</sup> month 1701 I surveyed to Edward Wilbourn ninty four Acres of Land in the Name of Rock: Lands beginning at a white oak standing in the line of Birmingham Township thence South South East in the line of James Chivers 220 perches to a post thence west South west 65 perches to a post thence nor: nor: west in the line of John Chalhan 257 perches to a post thence south 81 deg: east 73 perches in ye line of Burnin<sup>g</sup> Township to the first mentioned white oak
