


Vacant Land



By Virtue of a Warrant from ye Prop<sup>r</sup> Comm<sup>rs</sup> Dated ye 19<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1715  
 ye Surveyd to James Wright a Certain Tract of Land <sup>situate North</sup> of Warrington in Chester County

Beginning at a Small Black Oak standing in the line of John Churchman thence  
 North by ye said Churchman's Land one Hundred & Seventy perches to a Black Oak  
 thence East by Vacant Land two Hundred perches to a Chestnut Tree thence South  
 by Vacant Land one Hundred & Seventy perches to a post thence West by a line of  
 marked Trees two Hundred perches to ye place of Beginning containing two Hundred  
 acres with ye allowance of Six <sup>50<sup>th</sup></sup> Cent

Surveyd and laid out by ye Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup>'s Order the 17<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1716
