



Pursuant to a Warr^t from ye Prop^rs Comm^{tee} Dated ye 12th of ye 10th mo 1703 I surveyed & Laid out unto Thomas Wickersham for ye Use of Children five Hundred Acres of Land in ye Township of Hill Town in ye County of Chester being What Remains UnTaken up of a Thousand acres of Land purchased of ye Prop^r by Humphrey Killinbeck who made over one Sixtieth of his sd Purchase to ye sd Thomas Wickersham & of ye Rest Two hundred Acres to Humphrey Eldest son to ye sd Thomas & one hundred Acres a piece to Thomas John & Ann ye other Children of ye sd Thomas Wickersham

Beginning at a White Oak Standing in ye Line of ye London Tract being a Corner of Hannah Leamond's land thence West by the Land of ye sd Hannah Leamond Two Hundred perches to a Black oak thence South by a line of Marked Trees four hundred perches to a Black Oak thence East by a line of Marked Trees Two Hundred perches to a Black oak thence North by ye said London Tract four Hundred perches to ye place of Beginning
