By Virtue of a Warrant bearing date the twenty first day of October 1774, there was surveyed for Israel Morris on the fourth day of April 1776 the Tract of <sup>(omitted)</sup> above described Beginning at a stone in the line of Maryland, and running thence North one degree & an half East (crossing Octoraro Creek) twenty four perches to a post standing on the edge of the said Creek in Lancaster County, thence down the said creek on the same side thereof on the several courses by Land late of John Kirkpatrick one hundred and four perches to a post, thence South West eighteen perches to a Red Oak corner of Land late of John Stamersly thence by the same South thirty eight East nine perches to a White Oak, South twenty nine West thirty three perches to a White Oak South fifty four degrees West forty perches to a Spanish Oak, South three degrees West thirty perches to a post, West sixteen perches to a post, South one degree West ten perches to a post in the line of Maryland thence by the same South eighty eight degrees and an half East one hundred & thirty six perches to the place of Beginning containing and laid out for sixteen acres and ninety perches besides the usual allowance for roads the greatest part of which is situate in the County of Chester surveyed and certified by
