



In pursuance of an application made the 26th day of August 1765, by Frederick Spiegel, as well as an order dated at the Statehouse the 27th of July 1767, setting forth the tracks relative to the land in dispute between the said Spiegel and Oldam Stoeberly, surveyed the above described tract of land, unto the said Frederick Spiegel, Beginning at a post, thence North West fifty perches to a post set for a corner in a line of Spiegels other land. Thence by the same South West seventeen perches to another post set for a corner in ~~the~~ the same line thence South East fifty perches to a post, thence North East seventeen perches to the place of Beginning containing five Acres and the usual allowance of six acres per ct. for Roads &c, according to the directions of John Braxler and Nicholas Meyer, Mr. Shultz having by his Letter to me, given previous notice, that he could not possibly attend
