



In Puruance of a Warranty from the Proprietaries dated the second Day of October anno Domini 1735
Surveyed unto David Jones A Certain Tract of Land situate on a Branch of Sulphur Creek
called Mill Creek adjoining to and late of James Logan Beginning at a marked White Oak
in a Line of a Tract of Land laid out to James Logan at a Corner of George Graaf's and Michael
Hoyer's Lands thence extending by said Hoyer's Land East fifty two poles to a marked
black oak at another corner of said Hoyer's Land thence by Andrew Daltzeyer's Land North west
by North twenty poles to a post and North East one hundred and nine poles to a marked
White Oak thence by John Seller's and George Ruegels lands North West by North nine
ty eight poles to a Post thence by vacant Land South west by west one hundred and fif-
ty poles to a Post thence by said Graaf's Land South East by south one hundred and ten
poles to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred Acres and the usual Allow-
ance for Roads &c Surveyed the 9th Day of October anno Domini 1735
