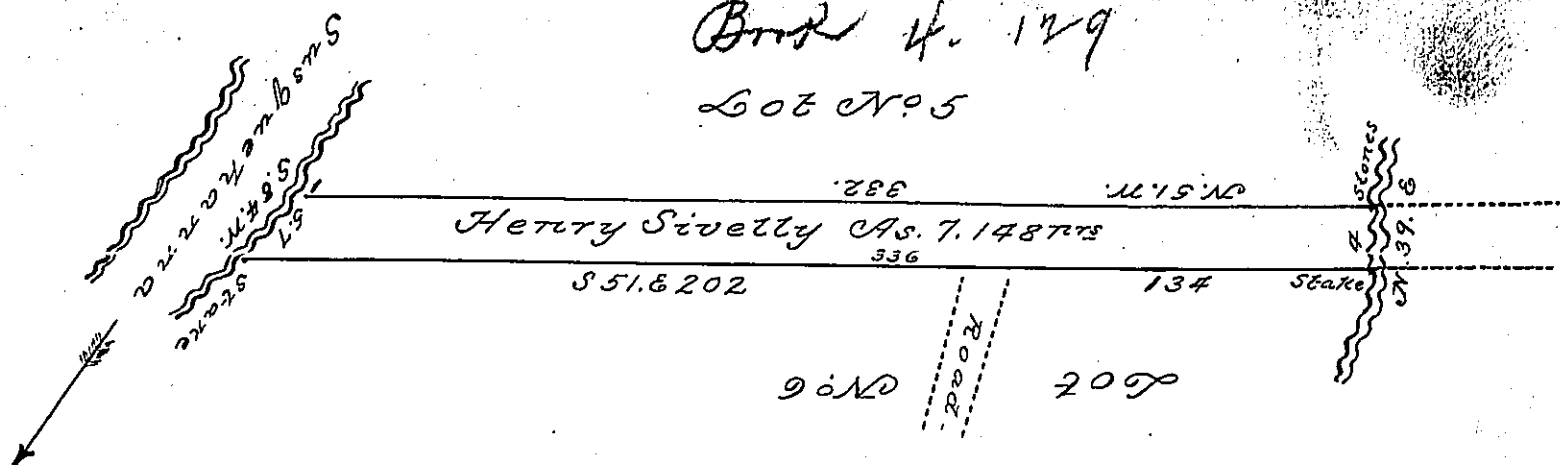

The above embraces part of a road originally appropriated ^{as such} by the Connecticut Susquehanna Company, has been released to the Commonwealth by a Pennsylvania claimant under the provisions of the compensating act passed Apr^l 4th 1799, but not applied for by a Connecticut settler, It is recorded as a public highway and the distance of one hundred and thirty four perches the southeastward by part thereof is used as such. The remainder is improved by George Lazarus and has been ^{or by those under whom he claims} for upwards of 20 years, ~~the~~ Lazarus owns Lots numbered 5 & 6 adjoining, the no actual settler resides on it
