



Draft of a tract of land Situate in the Certified Township of Wilkesbarre Luzerne County containing six acres and twenty two perches and the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads &c surveyed for Henry Sevetly February 16<sup>th</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup> 1822 in pursuance of a Warrant dated May 18<sup>th</sup> 1821, the same being adjoining the first, third, and fourth devissions of lots in 5<sup>th</sup> Township Samuel Cochran Esqr. Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup>. Josiah Lewis D. E. T. B. That part of the above survey which lays southwestwardly of the dotted line of a road running across it is a recorded road and used as such, so much of the above survey as fronts lots numbered, 42, 43, 44, 45, a 3 rod road, 46, 47, and 48 inclusive, <sup>1<sup>st</sup> devission</sup> is improved and has been for upwards of twenty years, by Elisha Blackman Samuel Williams, Charles Abbott and John Cortright or those under whom they claim, the no actual resident settler is on it. The warrant calls for a strip of land in addition to that contained in the above draft, between lots numbered 12 & 13 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> devission, but the certificates of return survey makes them to adjoin and bound one each other, and so does the actual measurement on the ground. And so much of said Warrant as calls for the land between lots numbered 8 & 9 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> devission, and the first devission is in the occupation of Henry Cortright an actual
