By Vertue of an Order from Jacob Taylor to me Derected  
 bearing date July the 18<sup>th</sup> 1722 to lay out to Joseph  
 Kirkbride on his order the quantity of five hundred ac-  
 res of land in Buck County now the May Serty lie that I  
 have surveyed to John Griffey one hundred acres of the  
 five which he hath sold and it never yett returned the  
 other four being sold to Joseph Worth and returned  
 some time agoe this Begining at a Corner Stone by a  
 marked white oak then South one ~~hundred~~ hundred and  
 sixty perches to a post and Stone then West by James  
 Irens on hundred and six perches to a Small White Oak  
 then north one hundred and sixty perche by vacant  
 land to a post then East one hundred and six perch  
 ch. by vacant land to the place of begining contain-  
 ing one hundred and six acres the six acre being as  
 usual allowance for Roads and highways lying in Bu-  
 cks County beyond the Great Swamp upon the head bra-  
 nch of Skooks Creek given under my hand the 29 day  
 of the first month march 1737 John Chapman  
 Skooks Creek
