



Claimed by Joseph Bullock  
 Warrant dated 11th December 1807

Situate on the waters of Salt-lick Creek in Saltlick Township  
 Fayette County, and surveyed the 22<sup>d</sup> day of February 1808 in-  
 cluding 234<sup>a</sup> 57 & allowance and returned into the Surveyor Gen-  
 eral's Office "by surprise" not noticing the quantity mentioned  
 in the Warrant viz 200<sup>a</sup> until return was made--On the 18<sup>th</sup> day of  
 August 1808 the Surplus was struck off and the Survey reduced to a  
 conformity with the Warrant--James McOwen or McOwen--had Cavated  
 the acceptance of the former Survey--but the parties have agreed by a  
 writing "now before me" under <sup>the</sup> hands & seals dated 30<sup>th</sup> July last to sub-  
 mit their difference to the Judgment of Abraham Workman or Work-  
 man a Neighbour "now present" James McOwen has also express-  
 ed his assent to the result of the Judgment by a Note or writing sent  
 to my Office in Order to remove the Bar against granting a patent--  
 no impediment is now in the way to my knowledge.
