



In Pursuance of an order from Jacob Taylor Surveyor General to me directed dated January 28th 1726 to me Directed, Requiring me to survey and lay out unto John and Isaac Leach Three hundred and seventy five acres of land Surveyed and layd out too John Leach and Isaac Leach afforesaid this 3 day of February 1726 the following Tract of Land Beginning at a Red Oak tree being and standing in the Corner of Edward Dhipers Land, thence extending by a line of marked trees North East 329 perches to a small White Oak thence S 16 by a line of marked trees 210 perches to a small Spanish oak sapling Thence by a line of marked trees 221 perches to a white oak tree in the line of Samuel Barkers Land Thence by sd Barkers Land N 150 perches to a hycory stump Thence by the said Barkers Land S 108 perches to a post Thence by the afforesaid Dhipers Land N 166 perches to the first mentioned place of Beginning Containing Three hundred seventy five acres - and six acres to y^e hundred acres for Allowance &c
