



Surveyed on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Novem<sup>r</sup> <sup>1735</sup> ~~1733~~ to Jacob Fiedler a tract of Land Situate in  
 Oley in the County of Prind<sup>l</sup>. Beginning at a Corner post of the Widow Bartolet's  
 Land thence by the same N W 81 to a post thence by Land of Hans Fiedler Youngman N E 132  
 to a Cheenut thence by Land of the Widow Kearson S E 81 to a post thence by the Land S. W  
 132 <sup>o</sup> to the place of Beginning. Cont<sup>y</sup> 63 acres with the usual allowances  
 A Warr<sup>t</sup> was granted to Jacob Fiedler for 50<sup>ac</sup>  
 dated the 16<sup>th</sup> April 1735 but his name is Fiedler  
 he has assigned his right to John Diedrick Youngman  
 a Warr<sup>t</sup> granted to John Diedrick Youngman 2<sup>d</sup> 8<sup>th</sup>  
 of April 1741
