



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the 20<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1737<sup>80</sup> Resurveying unto James Tregoe a small Tract of Land in Whiteland Township in the County of Chester (sold to him for fifty acres) being part of a larger Tract formerly granted to the executor of <sup>Thomas</sup> Lloyd deceased, I have Resurveyed unto the s<sup>d</sup> James Tregoe on the 26. day of the s<sup>d</sup> Month of July the s<sup>d</sup> small Tract of Land situate in the s<sup>d</sup> Township of Whiteland Beginning at a white oak at a corner of David Jenkins Land thence South Nine degrees East by the same 112 Poles to a post thence E. N. E. by other land of the s<sup>d</sup> James Tregoe & the land of Richard Eavenson 142 poles to a post thence North eight degrees west by the land of Richard Richardson 112 poles to a post thence W. S. W. by the land late of William Crouch and the land of the s<sup>d</sup> David Jenkins 144 poles to the place of Beginning Containing in the whole Ninety acres and a half besides the usual Allowance for Roads, that is to say, Fifty acres which the s<sup>d</sup> James claims Title to under the executor of the s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Lloyd, and forty acres and a half is the quantity of Overplus within the known lines and bounds of the s<sup>d</sup> small Tract
