



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property Dated the 20th of the 1716 there was Surveyd to Isaac Taylor in Right of W^m Beckingham, J^r Beckingham James Hayward & Samuel Bishop (who came into this province servants in or about the year 1682) a Certain Tract of Land in Marlborough in the County of Chester Beginning at a Black Oak Standing in the Society line being a Corner of the Land of Henry Hayse & East ~~xxx~~ by the sd Society line 190 pches to a post thence South by the Land of Joel Bayly 202 Pches to a post thence West 56 pches to a Plum Tree thence North 40° westerly by Vacant Land 217 pches to a Post thence North by East by the ~~land of the~~ Land of the said Henry Hayse 109 Pches to the Place of Beginning Containing Two hundred Acres with the Allowance of six Percent Surveyd the first day of April 1717 ~
