Bishop who came into This Province Servants in about the year 1682  
a Certain Tract of Land in Marlborough in the County of Chester  
Beginning at a Black Oak Standing in the Society Line being a  
Corner of the Band of Henry Hayes East ~~by~~ by the said Society  
Line 190 poles to a post thence South by the Band of Joel Bayly  
202 poles to a post thence West 56 poles to a Gun Tree thence  
North 40° West by Vacant Land 217 poles to a Post thence  
North by East by the ~~Band of~~ Band of the said Henry  
Hayes 109 poles to the Place of Beginning Containing Two  
hundred acres with the Allowance of six per cent  
Surveyed the first day of April 1717 ~
