North 24 degrees west by the sd Road fifteen perches and a half
to a white oak by the sd Road thence North 53 deg; East 140 per-
ches to a post thence south 24 deg: East seven perches and a half
to a post thence South 50 deg: West 140 perches to the first
mentioned black oak Resurveyed the 11th of the 1st Month
