Surveyed for Elizabeth James 150 acres of land lying on the South side of ridly creek beginning at a marked red oak standing at the mouth of a run of ridly creek and running by the run 80 perch S W to a marked white oak & from thence S W to W 240 perch to a black oak then N W to N 76 perch to a marked white oak then N E by 330 perch to a walnut standing by ridly creek and from thence down the creek on several courses to the first menchered red oak
