



By Virtue of two Warrants from the Commissioners of Property both bearing Date the \_\_\_ Day of November Anno Dni 1709 for Buying out to John Sanger & James Chevers (who came into this Province servants in the Year 1651) their proportion of head land viz <sup>52</sup>/<sub>50</sub> fifty acres each in the County of Chester There was Buyd out to Isaac Taylor (who the sd John Sanger & James Chevers soon after the date of the sd Warrant had sold their sd rights to) the sd two parcels of Land ~~situate~~ with the Allowance of Six acres <sup>thereof</sup> for Roads & Difference of Surveys situate in the Township of Bradford in the sd County of Chester Beginning at a Post being a corner of other Band of the sd Isaac Taylor thence East by North by Abial Taylors Band <sup>and the Band of Edward Worton</sup> 148 Pches to a Small Hickory thence North North West 117 Pches to a post thence West by South by Vacant Band 148 Pches to a Post thence South South East by the said Isaac Taylor's Band <sup>117</sup>/<sub>117</sub> Pches to the first mentioned Post. — Surveyd the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November 1716 p Isaac Taylor
