



Surveyed and laid out the 4<sup>th</sup> of December 1716 pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 12<sup>th</sup> of the first Month 1715/6 unto Reese Thomas of Hartford Kent. a certain Tract of Land in Newland in the County of Chester Beginning at a marked White Oak on the Eastern Side of a Small Branch of Brandywine Thence North by a line of marked Trees two hundred & twenty perches to a Gum Tree Then South Southwest by Vacant Land two hundred and ten perches to a White Oak Then South East by a line of marked Trees two hundred and twenty perches to a post Then North Northeast two hundred and ten perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred and fifty acres within the Common Addition or Allowance of Six P Cent Philadelphia the 3<sup>d</sup> of May anno 1718
