



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the Sleeping Place situate on the S.W. side of the Path leading from Chinglectamouche to the great Island about ten miles Eastward from Clearfield Creek & four or five from the west Branch <sup>of Susquehanna</sup> adjoining Lands of John Eldridge ~ supposed to be in the County of Northumberland containing three hundred and eleven Acres & thirty two Perches and the usual Allowance of Six Percent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 5<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1773 for Thomas Harrison in pursuance of a Warrant granted to him the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of May in the same year by
