



Zedoe Wright conveys a patent issuing
to John Barclay, calling his claim
as laid down on the Draft.

The whole survey containing 300 acres of land allowed claimed by John Barclay on his Warrant dated July 20th 1791 (1791)

The colored space south of the lines marked C.D.E.S.T. claimed by Zedoe Wright
R. Zedoe Wright's old farm - 17 poles distant from N. Dogwood Corner
and 7 poles from the line S. 6° W -

A new field claimed by Zedoe Wright 16 poles from N. Dogwood Corner
C.D.E.S.T. said by Zedoe Wright to be an agreed line between him & John Barclay
John Barclay's House 15 poles from the line D.S. which line runs near
John Barclay's orchard fence, and includes part of a grain field -

A tract of a Survey called "Cantydown" situated on the Waters of Peters Creek in Allegheny County, containing 300 acres and
the usual allowance executed on the 29th of April 1799 in Pursuance
of a Warrant granted to John Barclay for 300 acres dated
July 20th 1791 - and the disputed part delineated in
Sealures & Special Instructions for that purpose from
The Surveyor Genl. dated March 11th 1799.
