



Surveyed to John Wakefield, <sup>Genl</sup> on the 10<sup>th</sup> of May 1817 the above described tract of three hundred and eighty acres and forty eight perches and allowance of six per cent  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. Including an improvement adjoining lands of Alexander Fullerton Daniel King James Robb and others situate on the Chestnut ridge in Wheatfield Township in the County of Indiana By warrant of the 23<sup>d</sup> of December 1816

N.B. part of the above survey as represented by the dotted line and the letters A B & C was surveyed to Adam Altimus on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of October 1816 in pursuance of a warrant granted to said Altimus on the 26<sup>th</sup> of September 1816. Note the improvement of Wakefield was begun and continued for a number of years prior to the 28<sup>th</sup> of March 1814
