



By virtue of a Warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing Date the Twenty ^{fourth} of March Anno Domini 1738 I have Surveyed and Laid out unto Robt. Gilkison in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna River one hundred and forty two Acres of Land with allowance of 67 Cent Beginning at a Hickery by Conedaguenett Creek thence East Eighty perches to a White Oak South ninety five perches to a White Oak South West forty four perches to a Walnut South fifteen Degrees Westwardly Twenty seven perches to a Red Oak South nine Degrees Westwardly fifty four perches South Twenty Degrees Easter & twenty eight perches to a Hickery thence Westwardly nine perches to Tree Wood thence North one hundred and fifty five perches to a Hickery by the sd Creek thence Down the same Traversing the several Courses thereof near about Two hundred perches to the place of Beginning
