



The shaded lines in the above diagram represent the survey made to James Wallace on the 10th of April 1790. By order of the 3^d April 1769 re ~~order~~. It will be seen that Wallace's survey included the whole of the survey of Thomas Wilkins and a part of the survey of Frederick Boyer. Abner Wixson and Daniel Lintner occupy a part of Wallace's survey and claim under the title to Thomas Wilkins, and William Dougherty occupies a part and claims under the title to Frederick Boyer. Situate in Blacklick Township in the County of Franklin. The said interferences ascertained the 20th of February 1828. In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government & By the authority of the Board of Property.
