



In pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 14th of the month called March last Past, directed to Tho. Lightfoot Dep. Surveyor at his request & desire was surveyed for Tho. Sharp the small Tract of Land described by the above Draught. Situate adjoining the New Province Line in East Nottingham Township in the County of Chester. & in a Branch of Great Ck. Beginning at a Stone in or near the Line of New Menster's Tract & two perches & a half Southward of the said Branch & about 60 perches North Eastward of the said Thomas Sharp's Dwellinghouse, thence by the said New Menster's Line N. 111.20 p to a post by David Rankin's Fence, &c. as above specified

N.B. In order to avoid making more Courses & corners, 2 of the above described Lines extend across David Rankin's fence at N. & S. The Land being there not of much Value: Tho. Sharp did not desire the Lines to cross the fences, if it could have been avoided without a more irregular survey
